  challenging courses to build self-efficacy
  and prepare for college-level coursework.
- Equitable opportunities:

  Ensure equitable access to extracurricular and enrichment opportunities that build leadership, nurture talents, and increase engagement with school.
- Offer comprehensive support and information about college costs, financial aid, and scholarship opportunities to help gifted students and their families plan for college affordability.
