## 5 BEST PRACTICES FOR DEVELOPING POSTSECONDARY READINESS PROGRAMMING

Use needs assessments to determine where to focus your postsecondary efforts and then plan a calendar of programming



Involve students in planning (e.g. voting on career day speakers, contacting college reps, utilizing student clubs with a career focus)



Coordinate postsecondary programming for students with companion programming for families (e.g. when delivering a classroom lesson, send families a short video overview and/or handout)



Partner with teachers to offer workshops and learning opportunities for students (e.g., an activity researching and journaling about careers can be a collaboration between the English teachers and school counselors)



Collaborate across levels (i.e. elementary, middle, high) for large-scale events to engage families
