EQUITY BASED CAREER DEVELOPMENT

FACTORS IMPACTING POSTSECONDARY TRANSITIONS FOR BLACK STUDENTS

- Individual counseling and small group activities improve college readiness and access to critical information.
- Collaboration with families: Enhancing students' career readiness and attitudes toward school through active involvement and communication with families.
- Access to social and cultural capital:

 Leveraging relationships with external institutions and resources to enhance college and career readiness.



Equitable policies and training: Mandating equitable outcomes, providing career and college fairs, and offering culturally responsive training to support Black students.



Addressing systemic inequities: Tackling issues such as school funding disparities and systemic racism that can hinder successful postsecondary transitions for diverse students.
