- Advocate for antiracist policies and practices that dismantle racial injustice
- Identify school and community-based systems that influence and contribute to equitable postsecondary readiness and success
- Examine social emotional learning within sociopolitical and racial contexts and its connection to postsecondary attainment
- Acknowledge counseling/advising practices that have been complicit in perpetuating systemic racism
- Support the educational and postsecondary goals of all students, especially populations who have been traditionally underserved

What's a CEU?

Continuing Education Units (CEUs) provide a permanent record of your educational accomplishments in a non-credit educational program. CEUs are not academic units and do not appear on an SDSU transcript and cannot be applied to degree work at institutions of higher education.
